



Hungate Garden Project

Year 5 have done a brilliant job of finishing the roof panels to the bottle greenhouse. We spent last Sunday morning fixing the panels together and completing the roof. The greenhouse is now ready for growing!



We have continued planting donated perennials and shrubs, though there is a lot more to go in once the weather warms up.



I have also been working with year 5 on making seed trays from margarine tubs, small plant pots from newspaper, yoghurt pots and plastic bottles. This fits in with their theme of re-using single use plastic.



After Easter I will have a session with Year 5 to construct the 2 Bug Hotels. These are pallette stacks that will be filled with unwanted material that will provide a home for beneficial insects. Year 5 are primed to find unused pipes, cardboard, boxes, woollens and straw. We have already cut old fence posts to suitable lengths and drilled holes ready for insects such as solitary bees and lacewings.



All work on the garden has had to be stopped over Easter because there will be demolition and building work at school. Health and safety issues prevent access until the summer term begins.
